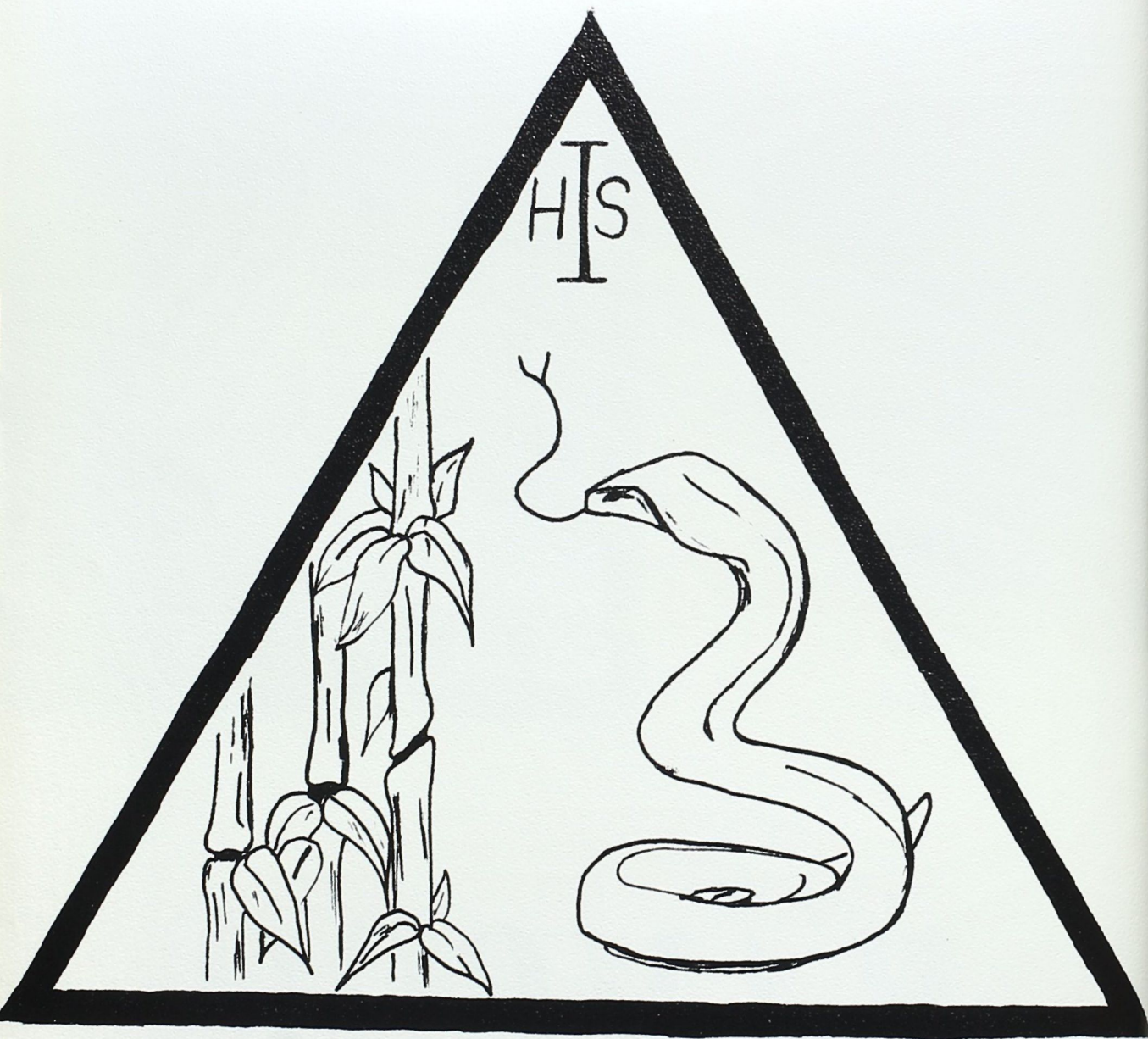

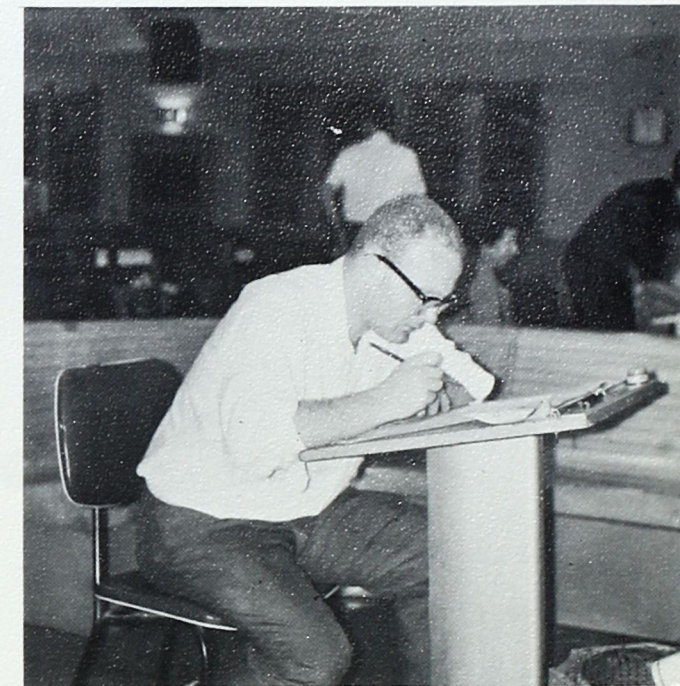
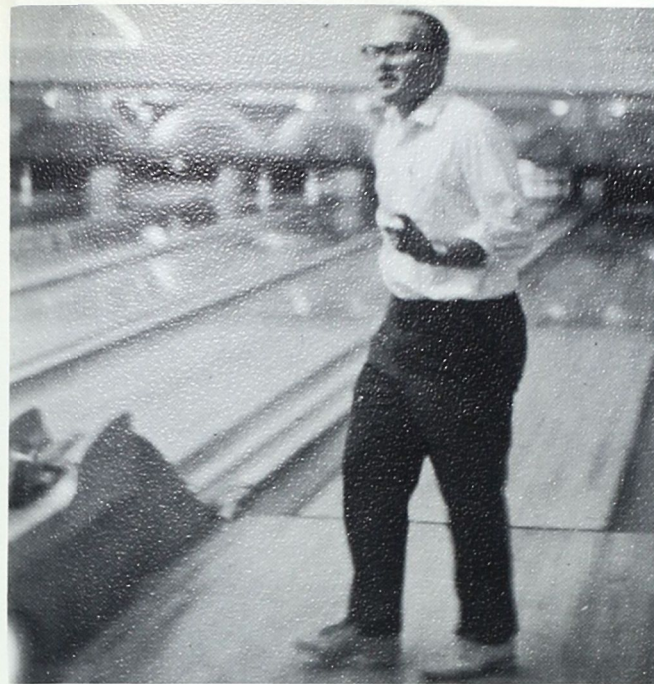

## *Dedication*

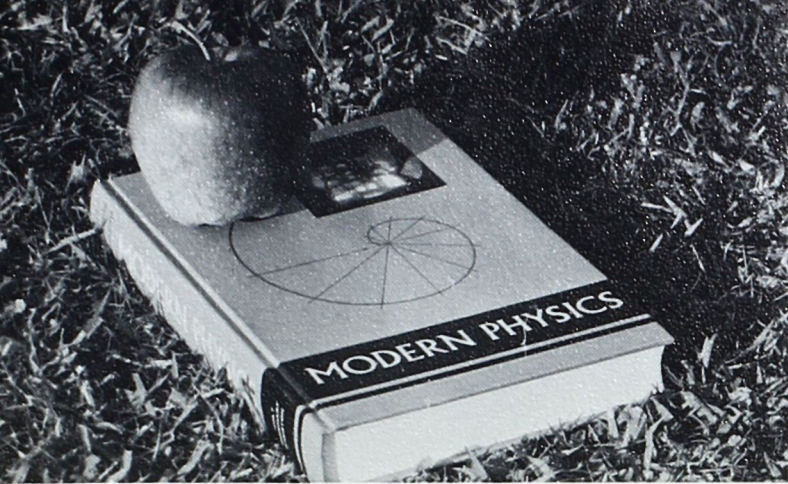
