




MEMORIES, MEMORIES, SHARED

WHO IS GARFIELD (GAR) BENSEN?

Gar Bensen arrived at Itazuke Air Base in November of 1955 at the age of 14, a newly minted Freshman. He was soon registered at Itazuke Dependents School (IDS).

Prior to coming to Itazuke he and his family were living in a small town north of Seattle, WA called Bothell. His dad had just completed 4 years teaching ROTC at the University of Washington when he received orders to relocate to Itazuke Air Base, Japan.

Gar states what he remembers the most about IDS was how small it was. He remembers eating lunch off of stainless steel divided trays brought from the "Mess Hall." As we all can attest the milk we drank in Japan was unlike any milk we drank in the States and was something to get used to. He also remembers how the school tried to make the school environment as much like home as possible. As many of us who were students during our time at Itazuke can attest to the friendliness of all of the students and how we were accepted as part of the group.

School sports were key to keeping the students active participants. Gar was a Cobra basketball player and was the team captain. Some of his teammates were Tim Biddle, Jim Martin, Dick Mathis and Dick Boorom.

When Gar and his family rotated back stateside in 1958 their next duty station was to Whiteman AFB, Missouri. Gar graduated from high school in 1959.

Upon graduation from college he joined the US Navy and successfully went through Flight Training. During his five year Navy commitment he had two duty stations and 9 months in Vietnam. After his five year military commitment was completed he relocated to Minneapolis, Minnesota in 1969 to fly for Northwest Airlines (NWA) for 33 years. He retired from NWA July 2, 2001, after flying Captain on the 747- 400 the last 3 years of his career.

Gar has two children, a son and a daughter, from a previous marriage. Gar remarried in 1980 to a woman who had 3 daughters, the same ages as his children. They flourished as a family of seven! Today Gar and his wife are the proud grandparents of 10 grandchildren and continue to be a close and loving family.

Gar and his wife live in Minneapolis, MN during the warmer seasons. During the winter months they are "Snowbirds" in Jacksonville, Florida, where their home is on the 17th hole at Hidden Hills Golf Club and play golf several days a week.




Cobra Hoopsters Avenge Previous Loss, 59 to 40
