# By-Law Amendments - Electronic Ballots

The Board of Officers recently approved amendments to the IAA By-Laws. Changes include electronic voting for elections and IAA business, identification of members and associate members, the addition of the Reunion Committee, and several administrative issues. The new by-laws are posted on Facebook on the IAA Information and Discussion group site and soon to be on the IAA web site.

Electronic voting represents a change in the way we vote on IAA business. Voting will now be done via an online balloting system. Hopefully, everyone can get online and participate. All that is needed is the same email address we use to distribute the Newsletter. If you get the Newsletter by email, you will get a ballot by email. For those who do not have an email address or would simply prefer, voting can also be by mail, proxy, or in person at the reunion meeting. Please pay attention to future notices in the newsletter if you plan to vote by mail, proxy, or in person because these methods will require manual entry into

the electronic system. Newsletters that are published just before the reunion will include ballot requests and proxy forms which you will have to mail to the Board. The votes will be tallied after the reunion meeting and announced at dinner. It sounds complicated but it is really easy and every member gets to vote.

Nominations for Board Officers and reunion venue will also be done by mail or email prior to the reunion meeting. Deadlines will be set to allow for mailing ballots and proxies to allow time for processing.

The Reunion Committee is hot and heavy on preparations for the 2018 Orlando reunion. We need a little feedback for the committee so I will try to get a survey out soon. You should have a current Passport. Also, consider purchasing the Insurance Option.



# Minutes of IAA board meeting 24 March 2017

The meeting was called to order by president Bob Clark at 2018 hours CDT 24 March 2017. The following board members were present via Skype group call: president Clark, VP Jim Dwyer, editor Teresa Green, and secretary Joseph Boling. Treasurer Jeanne Brown was present via landline phone at Clark's location, audible to all through his Skype connection.

The purpose of the meeting was to adopt revised bylaws for the Itazuke Alumni Assn. Draft revisions had been distributed and discussed by email for two months. The third draft was addressed and a handful of minor revisions made during this meeting.

Moved and seconded (Boling/Dwyer) to adopt the revised bylaws as corrected above. Passed unanimously. President Clark said that the new bylaws will be available at the IAA Discussion and Information group on Facebook and on the IAA website (Itazuke.org) for members to read.

Further discussion centered on administrative matters related to election procedures, proxy and ballot preparation for the next election, and recording of associate member data in the IAA membership database. No further motions were proposed.

The meeting adjourned about 2040 CDT.
